About Us

The Royal Highland Centre is more than a venue - it is a cultural and economic powerhouse.

- Scotland's largest indoor and outdoor events venue: Hosting over 150 events and welcoming more than 1 million visitors annually
- 280 acres of opportunity: A unique site combining exhibition halls, greenfield space, and world-class facilities.
- Home to the Royal Highland Show: The UK's biggest celebration of farming, food and rural life.

The Royal Highland Centre is operated by Highland Centre Ltd. (HCL), the trading subsidiary of RHASS (Royal Highland & Agricultural Society of Scotland). HCL generates vital income for RHASS, enabling the charity to deliver on its purpose of supporting Scottish agriculture, eduction and rural communities.







A Venue for Every Occasion

The Royal Highland Centre is a testament to adaptability and scale, blending agricultural heritage, high-energy entertainment, major exhibitions, and motorsport legacy across its 280-acre site.

Celebrating Heritage

Since 1960, the Royal Highland Show has anchored our calendar as the UK's premier agricultural showcase, drawing over 210,000 visitors, more than 1,000 exhibitors, and 5,500 animals each June. Alongside this, events such as AgriScot and the Scottish Smallholder Festival strengthen Scotland's rural identity and bring together industry professionals and communities.

World-Class Entertainment

Our venue transforms into some of the country's most exciting live venues for Summer Sessions, featuring superstars like Sam Fender, Paolo Nutini, Chappell Roan, and The Killers. We also host Terminal V, one of Europe's leading electronic music festivals, reflecting our long-standing partnership with Scotland's thriving live entertainment scene.

Exhibitions, Culture & Performance

The versatility of our halls allows us to host major events such as Comic Con Scotland (welcoming over 35,000 attendees in 2023) and Tabletop Scotland, alongside trade and lifestyle shows like Homebuilding Show. In 2024, we brought world-class theatre to Ingliston with a critically acclaimed, site-specific production of Macbeth, starring Ralph Fiennes and Indira Varma, transforming one of our halls into a truly immersive performance space.

Motorsport, Truckfest & Motoring Festivals

Our motorsport heritage is deep-rooted: between 1965 and 1994, the iconic Ingliston Racing Circuit hosted approximately 160 race meetings and launched the careers of motorsport legends including Jim Clark, Jackie Stewart, and David Coulthard. Today, the venue plays host to dynamic motorsport-focused events such as the Scottish Festival of Motoring, Truckfest Scotland and Ingliston Supercars.

Future-Focused Innovation

We continue to evolve our calendar, hosting immersive art experiences such as Beyond Van Gogh: The Immersive Experience, alongside community festivals and signature residencies. Our ambition remains grounded in heritage but propelled toward innovation and cultural relevance.
